Each year we receive around 400 complaints about dog related matters including fouling and barking, deal with around 150 stray dogs, patrol sites and license 40 premises under animal welfare legislation.

Information on where dogs are banned on Arun's beaches during the summer months

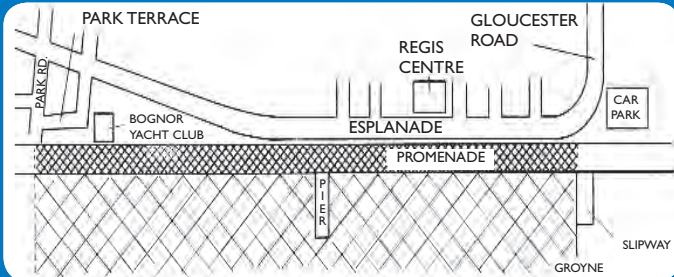


Dog fouling should be cleared up on all beaches all year round.

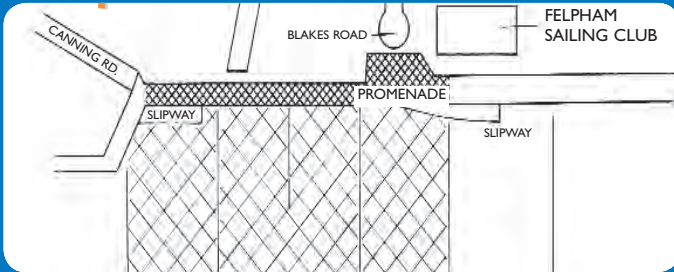

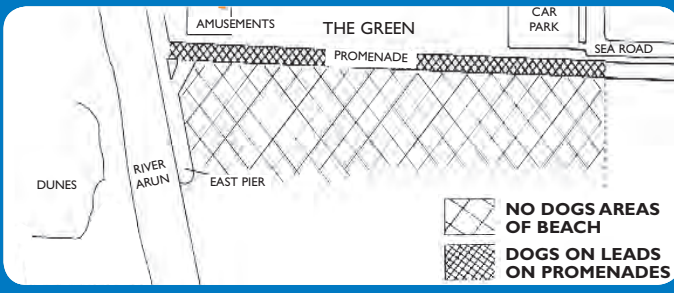
Bognor Regis

Exclusion

Dogs are not permitted on the following lengths of beach during the summer (1 May to 30 September).

Bognor Regis - Park Road to Gloucester Road

Felpham - Canning Road to Felpham Sailing Club

Littlehampton - East Pier to Norfolk Road.

Dogs must be kept on leads on promenades adjacent to banned beach areas.

Please observe the rules and look out for signs showing where dogs are banned. The beach ban does not apply to registered blind persons, or to deaf or disabled persons with trained assistance dogs.

On other beaches dogs can be freely exercised, but dogs should not cause a nuisance to other beach users or wildlife.

Fouling

The Arun District Dog Fouling Order applies to ALL beaches ALL year round. This requires dog walkers to clear up fouling straightaway. It is not an excuse to be unaware of the fouling or not have a poop-scoop.

Contravention of these orders is an offence liable to an £80 fixed penalty notice or a fine of £1000.
