

Conditions for street trading consents relating to arts and craft stalls and markets

The following conditions apply to arts and craft stalls and markets operating within the Arun district and which are licensed by Arun District Council. These conditions are not exhaustive and may be altered at any time without notification. Other conditions may be applied as necessary.

Core Criteria

1. Primary producer

The primary product must be all the producers own work. The producer must design and make all elements of the product. Bought-in or imports must not be sold.

Example:

- a) An artist who paints original pieces of art.
- b) A jeweller who cuts, solders, polishes materials to form an item of jewellery.
- c) Textile designers who create original patterns and make original items.

2. Designers and creative persons

The primary product is an assembly of bought-in components.

Example:

- a) Jewellery created from threaded beads and jewellery findings.
- b) Painting on to objects such as glasses or vases.
- c) Making items to other peoples designs.

3. Unique goods retailer

The primary product is one which demonstrates uniqueness to the market offer.

Example:

- a) Bought-in goods that demonstrate a unique, high level of design that make them an unusual specialised item.
- b) Selling food products (not produced by the trader) that constitute a unique gift.
