

## **Conditions for street trading consents relating to farmers stalls and markets**

The following conditions apply to farmers markets or individual stores operating within the Arun District and which are licensed by Arun District Council. These conditions are not exhaustive and may be altered at any time without notification. Other conditions may be applied as necessary.

### **Core criteria**

#### **1. Locally produced**

This is the area defined as 'local' from which the majority of producers will travel to sell the produce. Arun District Council has agreed that a 40 mile radius from the designated consented street shall be the defined area. Those producers from within the defined local area must be given preference.

#### **2. Principal producer**

The stall should be operated by someone directly involved in production, not just in other aspects of the producers business. This ensures the operator of the stall will have specialist knowledge and can advise consumers about the details of the product.

#### **3. Primary, own produce**

All produce must be grown or reared on the producers land. For livestock and plants this means grow or finished (having spent at least 50% to its life) on the producer's land. Preference should be given to the largest percentage of a products life cycle spent on the producers land.

#### **4. Secondary, own produce**

Anyone processing produce or adding value is a secondary producer. For processed products the base product must be substantially altered and they must contain as much local ingredient as possible, this means grown or reared within the defined area. Receipts should be kept as proof of origin. Must be brewed, pickled, baked, smoked or processed by the stall holder using at least one ingredient grown or reared within the defined local area. The base product should be substantially altered.

#### **5. Split stalls**

Small scale producers for example allotment associations, co-operatives or a fish monger selling on behalf of a number of local fishermen should be allowed to operate from a single stall provided the produce falls within the criteria 1 to 4 above.

### **Policy and Information**

Information should be available to customers at each market or stall about the rules of the market on production methods of the goods on offer.

Each market or stall should operate in accordance with Trading Standards, Environmental Health, alcohol licensing, market charters and other relevant legislation.

Conditions which are considered appropriate by the licensing authority may be attached to the street trading consent.
